



OFFICE PRIVACY AND AESTHETICS WON WITH LLUMAR



In keeping with the current trend toward open plan office spaces, glass is used as the divider for work areas, conference rooms and open hallways.

Glass walled office cubicles and conference rooms create a sense of freedom and openness but leave the interiors spare with little privacy.

Mary E. Smith, Facilities Manager for Davis and Wilkerson was determined to overcome the drawbacks of an otherwise perfect office layout. She consulted with a local window tinter, who recommended installing frosted window film on the interior glass areas. A non-reflective film was selected, LLumar® NRM-PS Frosted.

The white frosted film provides an elegant look throughout the office area and delivers private spaces where attorney and clients can meet unobserved. The LLumar film reduces visible light by 31%, thereby giving the glass an attractive opaque quality. The film also helps protect the office furnishings from fading by blocking most UV light, the principal cause of fading, from penetrating the interior glass areas. Furthermore, the film adds an important safety factor in the form of protection from broken glass in that it forms a shield across the glass to which it is fitted so that if the glass is broken most fragments will be held in place.

The professionally applied installation was quick and caused little or no inconvenience. Maintenance is easy using standard cleaning products, including those with ammonia.

The non-reflective LLumar film, which was chosen, helps Davis & Wilkerson retain the open ambience that was desired while still achieving the important privacy that is often needed in client-attorney relations.
